

Ticket Information

Token



Entry Touch token on gate sensor.



Exit Insert token into the ticket gate slate to leave the station.

- Available at ticketing machines at all stations.
- Valid only on day of issue.

One-Day Passes

- Price : NT\$150.
- Vending locations : Information counters at all Metro stations.
- Valid for **unlimited** Metro travel from activation until end of service on the same day.



24/48/72hr Taipei Metro Pass

- Price: NT\$180/280/380.
- Vending locations: Information counters at all Metro stations.
- This ticket is valid for unlimited travel on the Taipei Metro within 24/48/72 hours of first use. It is only valid for one passenger at a time.
- The ticket cannot be topped up and does not include any refundable deposit.



Group Tickets

- Vending locations : Information counters at all Metro stations.
- Usable only on the day of purchase, not refundable after use. Tickets must bear the TRTC stamp. Return upon exiting the station.
- Persons using group tickets must enter and exit the station together through the service gate by the information counter.
- Discount: 20% off for groups of 10 or more; 30% off for groups of 40 or more.

One-Way Bicycle Fare

- NT\$80 per ticket (including one-way fare for passenger and bicycle). Full-fare tickets only. No mileage limitations.
- Bicycle access available on weekends and national holidays, from 06:00 to closing.
- No bicycle access at the following stations (including transfers): All stations on the Wenhu Line, Tamsui, Taipei Main, Daan, Zhongxiao Fuxing and Nanjing Fuxing.

EasyCard



- Price:
 - Second generation EasyCards are sold outright at NT\$100 each (no deposit nor stored value).
- Terms of Use: 20% discount off single Metro trips. Card can be topped up for multiple journeys.
- To top up: Go to any information counter, single-journey ticket sales machine with top-up function, or EasyCard top-up machine.
- Refund Policy:
 - Second generation EasyCards: Refund is free if the card has been used 5 times or more over a period of 3 months or longer.
 - Deposit-based EasyCard: Refund is free if the EasyCard has been used 5 times or more over a period of 3 months or longer. In the event of human damage, a portion of the refund will be deducted as reparation.

How to use the EasyCard



- ① Place EasyCard on sensor
- ② Check onscreen ticket information
- ③ Enter/exit station when the gate opens

▲ If the balance on your card is insufficient, the fare will be deducted from the deposit to allow you to exit the station. You must recharge your EasyCard before using it next time.

▲ Each EasyCard only allows station access for one person; do not scan several EasyCards at the same time.

▲ EasyCard users receive a discount when transferring between bus and Metro within one hour.

iPASS



- Price: NT\$100 (no stored value).
- Where to buy an iPASS: All Taipei Metro information counters sell general adult cards (no deposit or stored value).
- 20% off all metro trips. There is also a transfer discount each time you make a transfer between metro and bus within one hour.

How to use the iPASS



- ① Touch your iPASS here (each row of gates has one dedicated sensor).
- ② Check screen for fare and card balance.
- ③ Enter/leave the station as gates open.

Regulations

- The following actions are prohibited in the Metro system. Violators will be prosecuted.
 1. Smoking
 2. Spitting (including betel-nut juice and chewed remains)
 3. Littering (cigarette butts, chewing gum, fruit or fruit peels, betel nut juice and other refuse)
 4. Eating or drinking in food-free areas (including chewing gum or betel nut)
- Permitted lingering time in paid areas:
 1. 2 hours maximum when entering and exiting at different stations; 15 minutes when entering and exiting from same station.
 2. Persons exceeding the time limit will be charged the required fare plus an additional fee equal to the minimum one-way ticket price. For EasyCard users, the amount will be deducted automatically at the ticket gate.
- Children under 115 cm or over 115 cm but under 6 years (ID required) may ride free (The child must be accompanied by a paying passenger. Each paying passenger may accompany up to two children).
- Pets must be crated, except police dogs or seeing-eye dogs. The head, tail and limbs of the pet should not be exposed. Each paying passenger is limited to carrying one crated animal.

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UNIVERSIADE



1 Mangrove Nature Reserve

- Hongshulin, meaning "mangrove" in Chinese, is a typical estuarine ecosystem populated by Kandelia, mudskippers, fiddler crabs and waterfowl. The cyclic changes in the water's salinity have allowed Kandelia to become the dominant plant species of the area.
- At exit 2, Hongshulin Station.
- Mangrove Forest Ecologic Exhibition Hall, weekdays 09:00–16:30 except Mondays. Outdoor areas are open all day.



5 Taipei Expo Park

- A public park area spanning Yuanshan Park, the Fine Arts Park and Xinsheng Park.
- Exit 1 at Yuanshan Station.
- Take bus Red 50 or walk to the other park areas.
- Outdoor areas are open 24 hours. See individual sites for indoor opening times.



9 Taipei 101

- Travel to the 89th floor Observatory on the high-speed elevators to enjoy a panoramic view of the city.
- Exit 4 at Taipei 101 / World Trade Center Station.
- 09:00–22:00 (Last entry 21:15)



13 Xingtian Temple

- This temple is devoted to the patron god of businessmen, Guan Yu, and is one of the most popular temples in Northern Taiwan.
- Exit 3 at Xingtian Temple Station, walk towards Songjiang Rd.-Minquan E.Rd. intersection for about 4 minutes.
- 04:00–22:30



2 National Palace Museum

- One of the top five museums in the world, The collection boasts more than 690,000 bronzes, jades, shell-and-bone writings, paintings, and calligraphic works from Neolithic times through the end of the Qing Dynasty.
- Take bus Red 50, 304, 255, 815, Little 18 or Little 19 at Shilin Station, to the National Palace Museum stop.
- Sun-Thu 08:30–18:30
- Fri-Sat 08:30–21:00



6 Chiang Kai-Shek Memorial Hall

- This impressive structure, built to commemorate the late President Chiang Kai-shek, contains an art gallery and lecture hall, and is surrounded by Chinese gardens. It is also a favorite leisure spot for Taipei residents.
- Exit 5 at Chiang Kai-Shek Memorial Hall Station.
- 09:00–18:00 (closed on Chinese New Year's Eve and New Year Day)



10 Lin Family Mansion and Garden

- Built in the Qing Dynasty, the mansion is majestically decorated. It was one of the very few large buildings of its time, and is the only fully preserved garden architecture in Taiwan.
- Exit 1 at Fuzhong Station, walk along Fuzhong Road, turn right at Wenchang Street, then turn left at Ximen Street, and the mansion is about 30 meters away.
- 09:00–17:00 (Closed on the 1st Monday of each month, Chinese New Year's Eve and Chinese New Year's Day. See official website for more information).



14 Martyrs Shrine

- Completed in 1969, this structure in the style of the National Palace's Taihe Hall is a landmark of the Yuanshan Area. The official changing of the Guards ceremony is held every hour from 09:00, with the final ceremony moved forward at 16:40.
- From Dazhi Station, take bus 208 to the Martyrs Shrine stop.
- 09:00–17:00 (Half-day on Mar. 29 and Sep. 3; closed on Mar. 28 and Sep. 2)



8 Shilin Official Residence

- This is where the late President Chiang Kai-shek lived with Madame Chiang. The Residence is surrounded by the Shilin Horticulture Gardens, the Horticulture Gallery, European Gardens, Chinese Gardens, the Xinlan Pavilion, a fountain, and a chapel.
- At exit 2, Shilin Station. About 10 minutes' walk in the direction of Fulin Road.
- Tue-Sun 09:30–12:00 (Last entry 11:20)
- 13:30–17:00 (Last entry 16:20)



7 National Museum of History

- Built in 1955, the Museum is a large structure of green tiled roofs and red brick walls. The museum's collection consists primarily of Chinese cultural relics, including bronze ware, green silky pottery and Tang sancai.
- Exit 1, 2 at Chiang Kai-Shek Memorial Hall Station, walk along Nanhai Road for about 10 minutes.
- Tue-Sun 10:00–18:00 (Closed on Mondays)



11 Longshan Temple

- Built in 1738, the temple is a historic site and important local religious center of the Wanhua area.
- Exit 1 at Longshan Temple Station. Head north on Xiyuan Road for 5 minutes.
- 06:00–22:00



15 Taipei Zoo

- The Zoo is divided into eight areas, including a petting zoo and an Asian tropical rain forest area. The introduction of koalas, king penguins and pandas over recent years has been very popular with visitors.
- Walk to the zoo from exit 1 at Taipei Zoo Station.
- 09:00–17:00 (Last entry 16:00; closed on Chinese New Year's Eve)



4 Taipei Fine Arts Museum

- Taiwan's first modern art museum, showcasing both national and international modern and contemporary art. The Museum opened its Children's Art Education Center in 2014, which forms part of a cultural park in conjunction with its surroundings.
- At Yuanshan Station. Walk through the Yuanshan Park Area of the Taipei Expo Park, turn left onto Zhongshan N. Road.
- Tue-Sun 09:30–17:30 (Closed on Mondays)
- Sat 09:30–20:30 (Admission free after 17:00)



8 Daan Park

- Located in the Daan District, this park is the "lungs of Taipei". Mostly consisting of forest landscape, it provides fresh air and an enjoyable green environment for leisure and recreation.
- Exit 2, 3, 4 and 5 at Daan Park Station.
- Outdoor space, open all day.



12 National Sun Yat-Sen Memorial Hall

- The hall's architecture was inspired by ancient Chinese palaces. The auditorium within can hold 3,000 people. The square in front of the hall is a popular venue for everyday exercise and leisure activities while the hall is commonly used for art exhibitions.
- Exit 4 at Sun Yat-Sen Memorial Hall Station.
- 09:00–18:00 (closed on Chinese New Year's Eve and New Year Day)



16 Maokong Gondola

- The first sightseeing cable car in Taipei.
- Walk to the Maokong Gondola station from exit 2 at Taipei Zoo Station.
- Tue-Thu 09:00–21:00
- Fri & day before national holidays 09:00–22:00
- Sat & national holidays 08:30–22:00
- Sun & last Day of extended holidays 08:30–21:00
- Closed for maintenance on non-holiday Mondays.
